TAKE THIS LETTER TO YOUR FIRST VET VISIT WITH YOUR PUPPY. MAKE SURE YOU TAKE YOUR AUSTRALIAN VET CERTIFICATE MEDICAL RECORD WITH YOU!

Dear VET,

One of our precious Australian Labradoodle puppies is now under your expert care.

In Australia it is illegal for anyone other than a qualified veterinarian to administer vaccinations, so your new puppy patient has arrived with his/her vaccination history outlined and signed by our certified Aqis Australian veterinarian. Puppy's new human parents should also have received this puppy's report on overall condition and temperament on the final examination prior to that of the Export Veterinarian immediately prior to shipping.

In light of recent veterinary discoveries concerning the very real dangers of over-vaccinating and its potential to trigger auto immune deficiency disease. We feel sure you are familiar with * Dr. Jean Dodson and we respect her work, so we are anxious that vaccines already administered are not inadvertently given again.

The puppy has been vaccinated with what Australia calls the C3 live vaccine. This protects against DISTEMPER HEPATITIS and PARVO VIRUS and will remain effective until this puppy reaches ten weeks of age at which time a follow up vaccination needs to be done.

We use the tri-annual vaccination protocol. After the ten weeks old vaccination is given, no further boosters are needed until the puppy reaches fifteen months old at which time the so called 'permanent' is given which will protect this dog for another thirty six months according to the specifications of the drug company.

We understand that each country and region of that country may require various other vaccinations for diseases such as Leptosporosis, Lyme, and Rabies. But we believe that it is in the best interests of our puppies sent overseas that each veterinarian will not repeat vaccines already given and current. We would also further request that multiple vaccines not be administered at the one time unless absolutely necessary *refer Dr Jean Dodd's articles on vaccinosis.
